Dear Brothers,

Happy Month of May. We give thanks to the Lord for all of the beautiful things he has given us. This month it appears that our Readings and Gospels are from The Acts of the Apostles, The First Letter of Peter, and The Gospel According to John.

In Acts, Luke describes the church's early development from Jesus' resurrection to Paul's first Roman imprisonment. (The Catholic Study Bible). I've enjoyed studying these books and recommend that if any of you has extra time on your hands you

begin a study of the Word of the Lord. There are so many ways to study the Word that make it an enjoyable and fruitful experience. I started by studying the first 5 books of the Old Testament and then the 4 Gospels. This pandemic revealed to me that the events we support at St. Kilian, although highly necessary for fellowship and charity, do not transfer over well to a media-based environment. An on-line study of the Bible is a method of helping others and for me, essential. In John 1:1, it states that "In the beginning was the Word and the Word was with God, and the Word was God" John 1, goes on to describe what happened to Jesus and states that "the Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us".

To me the studying (not just reading) the Bible is my ongoing conversation with our Lord. It gives me great peace and joy. I presently have the capability to host Zoom meetings of up to 50 participants. If anyone is interested in starting a Bible study for the Knights and St. Kilian parishioners, please contact me. Dear Brothers,

May is the month dedicated to our Blessed Mother Mary. On Friday, the USCCB Bishops consecrated our nation to the Blessed Mother, I couldn't think of a better way to start the Marian Month of May which is full of joyous events: the Ascension of the Lord, Pentecost and of course the celebration of Mother's Day for both our own mothers and the Blessed Mother to us all, Mary. In my Rosary corner I have included all the Joyful Mysteries which appropriately have the Mysteries of the Annunciation, the Visitation, the Nativity and Presentation in which Mary plays an important role. I encourage all my Brothers to continue praying the Rosary as much as possible, asking Mary to pray for us and for her intercessions during this global pandemic.

Second, I want to address a need for blood donations with many blood drives being postponed or canceled due to the pandemic. As Knights, we should help when we see a need, so I stepped up and signed up online and donated blood to the SC Blood Bank at the San Clemente mobile location on 4/25. Donations are by appointment only and you can find the upcoming mobile donation locations and make appointments online at their website SCBloodBank.org.

So when you donate you will need to wear personal protective gear: a mask and gloves. The SCBlood Bank provides gloves if you don't have any gloves. You will be asked a series of screening



questions for covid19 and they will take your temperature when you arrive and right before you donate. I wore googles as an extra precaution, since my wife, Sally is immuno compromised. I felt the donation process was done very safely with lots of social distancing. Its a great way to help those in need and possibly help save a life.

Dear Brothers,

We are at day 276 of California's "Stay at Home" directive, or at least it feels that way. Lent was here and now we are in the Easter Season with Pentecost Sunday at the end of the month on May 31st. But with the absence of Mass, the Eucharist, and Confession it doesn't feel like Eastertime. And in that is an important lesson. The Eucharist doesn't always "feel" like the flesh of Christ, our Lord and savior. But with our faith we know that Christ is truly present in the bread and wine. And so I ask you brothers to look at the calendar with those very same eyes of faith and know that this is Eastertime.

On Ash Wednesday and Good Friday the Church asks us to fast from food to raise our awareness of the physical vs. the spiritual. But I know that on the day after fasting I appreciate my meals a little more than the other days of the year. My point is that right now we are being forced to fast from gathering together to worship, celebrate, and to share fellowship. When we can finally gather again it will be a time of great celebration. The challenge for us will be to retain that sense of celebration throughout the rest of the year and the rest of our lives.

There are a few things that I want to bring up regarding our brotherhood and our councils. Council elections are coming up and nominating and voting will have to be done without an in person meeting. This is new territory for us. Your Grand Knight should have received some suggestions on how to accomplish this. Yes, it will be different. Yes, it will be a change. No, we haven't done it this way in the past. Please accept your Grand Knight's choice and adapt to it as best you can. We will have plenty of work to do.

Secondly, when your parish opens up there will be a huge pent up demand for First Reconciliation, First Communion, Confirmation, and many more activities that have been postponed just like our own council meetings. Scheduling of parish facilities will be hard. But we are loyal to and support our priests. Allow them the flexibility of scheduling our meetings and events last while they work through the opening. We need to support them with our flexibility and our willingness to help with those activities through ushering, parking lot management, and the other support functions that will be needed.

Thirdly, there are online exemplifications for the First through Third Degrees. Attend one and become a Third Degree Knight if you aren't a Third Degree Knight yet. Better yet, ask a friend who isn't a Knight to join us and attend the online exemplification with you. We always should endeavor to expand our fraternity.

Lastly, I got a note that some relaxation around donating money has occurred. Councils can ignore Supreme by-laws Section 122 B, which is procedures for paying expenses over \$500 for non-budged items if Covid-19 related. If a Council wants to donate to charities such as Columbian Charities (365 Club), Santa Ana Life Clinic, ID Drive, their Parish, etc. and the amount is over \$500 that is OK as long as their is ample opportunity for member discussion. A motion, discussion, and majority vote is all that is needed per our Worthy State Deputy, Brother Dave Abbot.

Renewal of the Consecration of the United States of America to the Blessed Virgin Mary

May 1,
2020



As the world continues to face the ongoing effects of the global pandemic of the coronavirus, Archbishop José H. Gomez of Los Angeles and president of the USCCB has announced that the U.S. bishops will join the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops on May 1 in renewing the consecrations of the two nations to the care of our Blessed Mother.

Through a collective dedication or entrustment of a nation to Mary, an act of consecration is meant to be a reminder to the faithful of the Blessed Mother's witness to the Gospel and to ask for her effective intercession before her Son on behalf of those in need.

From USCCB Liturgy:

PRAYER OF RENEWAL OF OUR CONSECRATION TO THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY

Let us now entrust our country and ourselves once again to the Virgin Mary's care:

Most Holy Virgin Mary, Mother of the Church, you are the fairest fruit of God's redeeming love; you sing of the Father's mercy and accompany us with a mother's love.

In this time of pandemic we come to you, our sign of sure hope and comfort.

Today we renew the act of consecration and entrustment carried out by those who have gone before us.

With the love of a Mother and Handmaid, embrace our nation which we entrust and consecrate once again to you, together with ourselves and our families.

In a special way we commend to you those particularly in need of your maternal care.

Mary, Health of the Sick, sign of health, of healing, and of divine hope for the sick, we entrust to you all who are infected with the coronavirus.

Mary, Mother of Consolation, who console with a mother's love all who turn to you, we entrust to you all those who have lost loved ones in the pandemic.

Mary, Help of Christians, who come to our rescue in every trial, we entrust to your loving protection all caregivers.

Mary, Queen and Mother of Mercy, who embrace all those who call upon your help in their distress, we entrust to you all who are suffering in any way from the pandemic.

Mary, Seat of Wisdom, who were so wonderfully filled with the light of truth, we entrust to you all who are working to find a cure to this pandemic.

Mary, Mother of Good Counsel,

Accept with the benevolence of a Mother the act of consecration that we make today with confidence, and help us to be your Son's instruments for the healing and salvation of our country and the world. Mary, Mother of the Church, you are enthroned as queen at your Son's right hand: we ask your intercession for the needs of our country, that every desire for good may be blessed and strengthened, that faith may be revived and nourished, hope sustained and enlightened, charity awakened and animated; guide us, we pray, along the path of holiness. Mary our Mother, bring everyone under your protection and entrust everyone to your beloved Son, Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Our Lady of Fatima May 13, 2020



Miracle at Fatima:

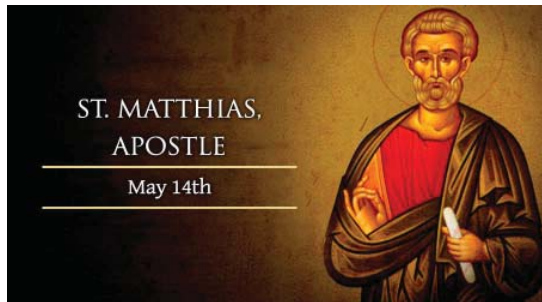
Between May 13 and October 13, 1917, three Portuguese children—Francisco and Jacinta Marto and their cousin Lucia dos Santos—received apparitions of Our Lady at Cova da Iria near Fatima, a city 110 miles north of Lisbon. Mary asked the children to pray the rosary for world peace, for the end of World War I, for sinners, and for the conversion of Russia.

Mary gave the children three secrets. Following the deaths of Francisco and Jacinta in 1919 and 1920 respectively, Lucia revealed the first secret in 1927. It concerned devotion to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. The second secret was a vision of hell. When Lucia grew up she became a Carmelite nun and died in 2005 at the age of 97.

Pope John Paul II directed the Holy See's Secretary of State to reveal the third secret in 2000; it spoke of a "bishop in white" who was shot by a group of soldiers who fired bullets and arrows into him. Many people linked this vision to the assassination attempt against Pope John Paul II in St. Peter's Square on May 13, 1981.

The feast of Our Lady of Fatima was approved by the local bishop in 1930; it was added to the Church's worldwide calendar in 2002.

St. Matthias, the Apostle May 14 2020



Saint Matthias' Story

According to Acts 1:15-26, during the days after the Ascension Peter stood up in the midst of the brothers—about 120 of Jesus' followers. Now that Judas had betrayed his ministry, it was necessary, Peter said, to fulfill the scriptural recommendation that another should take his office. "Therefore, it is necessary that one of the men who accompanied us the whole time the Lord Jesus came and went among us, beginning from the baptism of John until the day on which he was taken up from us, become with us a witness to his resurrection" (Acts 1:21-22).

They nominated two men: Joseph Barsabbas and Matthias. They prayed and drew lots. The choice fell upon Matthias, who was added to the Eleven.

Ascension of the Lord May 21 or 24th 2020



The Feast of the Ascension is the fortieth day after Easter Sunday, which commemorates the Ascension of Christ into heaven, according to Mark 16:19, Luke 24:51, and Acts 1:2. In the Eastern Church this feast was known as analepsis, "the taking up", and also as the episozomene, the salvation, denoting that by ascending into His glory, Christ completed the work of our redemption.

The terms used in the West, ascensio and, occasionally, ascensa, signify that Christ was raised up by His own powers. Tradition designates Mount Olivet near Bethany as the place where Christ left the earth. The feast falls on Thursday. It is one of the Ecumenical feasts ranking with the feasts of the Passion, of Easter and of Pentecost among the most solemn in the calendar. The feast has a vigil and, since the fifteenth century, an octave which is set apart for a novena of preparation for Pentecost, in accordance with the directions of Leo XIII.

As Catholics we should remember that the ascended Jesus is still with us because of His promise, "I am with you always; yes, to the end of time." He is with us at all times and in all places, releasing the Holy Spirit upon the world.

The Lord is now "seated at the right hand of the Father" as we profess in the Nicene Creed, meaning He alone is in control of the continuing plan of salvation through the Holy Spirit, unrestricted by time, space or culture. Thus, in the Paschal Mystery, Jesus' passion, death, Resurrection, Ascension and the sending of the Holy Spirit form one unbroken reality which is to be understood by Faith. The Ascension means that Jesus, His salvific suffering for our Salvation completed, is with his Father in glory. Being seated at the right hand of the Father is the fulfillment of "the prophet Daniel's vision concerning the Son of Man: 'To him was given dominion and glory and kingdom, that all peoples, nations, and languages should serve him; his dominion is an everlasting dominion, which shall not pass away, and his kingdom one that shall not be destroyed'" (CCC #664).

Pentecost Sunday May 31, 2020



Pentecost always occurs 50 days after the death and resurrection of Jesus, and ten days after his ascension into heaven. Because Easter is a moveable feast without a fixed date, and Pentecost depends on the timing of Easter, Pentecost can fall anywhere between May 10 and June 13.

The timing of these feasts is also where Catholics get the concept of the Novena - nine days of prayer - because in Acts 1, Mary and the Apostles prayed together "continuously" for nine days after the Ascension leading up to Pentecost. Traditionally, the Church prays the Novena to the Holy Spirit in the days before Pentecost.

The name of the day itself is derived from the Greek word "pentecoste," meaning 50th. Pentecost: The "50th" day at the end of the seven weeks of Easter when Christ's Passover is fulfilled in the outpouring of the Holy Spirit, manifested, given, and communicated as a divine person: of his fullness, Christ the Lord, pours out the Spirit in abundance. (CC 731) On this day, the Holy Trinity is fully revealed. Since then, the Kingdom announced by Christ has been open to those who believe in him: in the humility of the flesh and in faith, they already share in the communion of the Holy Trinity. By his coming, which never ceases, the Holy Spirit causes the world to enter into the "last days", the time of the Church, the Kingdom already inherited though not yet consummated. (CC 732)

Its Election time, please review the Duties of Council Officers.

Chaplain

- Serves as spiritual advisor to the brother Knights and families of that council
- Provides his message to members at the beginning of the meeting as outlined in the *Method of Conducting Council Meetings* (#10318) or whenever it best suits his schedule

Grand Knight

- Presides over all meetings
- Appoints program and membership directors
- Appoints committees as needed
- Countersigns checks and orders for payment
- Responsible for the council's First Degree Team

Deputy Grand Knight

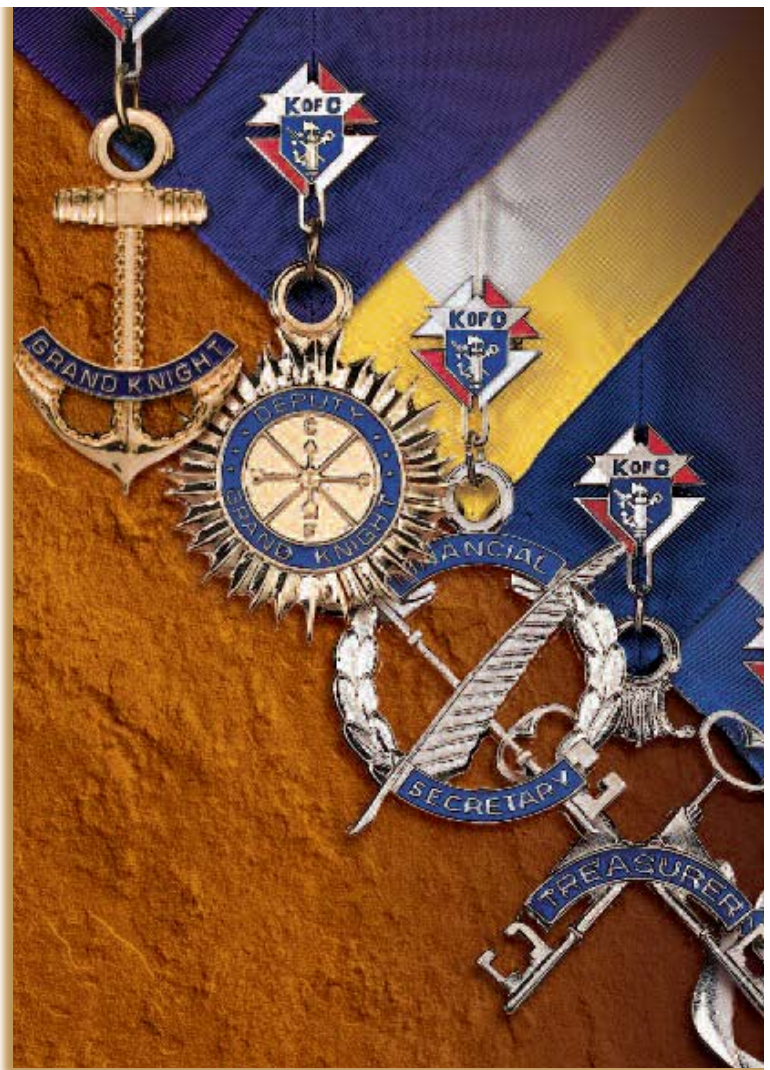
- Assists the grand knight with operation of the council and any other duties assigned to him by the grand knight
- In the absence of the grand knight, presides at council meetings
- Recommended to serve on the council's Retention Committee

Chancellor

- Has the duty of strengthening the members' interest in council activities
- Assists the grand knight and deputy grand knight with their duties as assigned
- Recommended to serve on the council's Admission Committee

Financial Secretary

- Upon recommendation of the grand knight and the trustees, the financial secretary is appointed for a three-year term that is approved by the supreme knight
- The prospective financial secretary must also complete and submit the *Application for Appointment as Financial Secretary* (#FS-101)
- Under Section 130 of the Laws of the Order, the financial secretary is automatically bonded in the amount of \$5,000. Additional bonding may be provided at a cost of \$7 per thousand by contacting the supreme secretary's office



- Collects money, in the form of dues, from members. Responsible for sending billing notices and initiating retention measures by providing a list of delinquent members to the grand knight to prevent members from being suspended for nonpayment of dues
- Ensures that the council membership records are updated and that new members sign the constitutional roll
- Receives from the Supreme Council Headquarters honorary and honorary life membership cards for distribution to qualified members
- Files various reports and membership/insurance transactions with the Supreme Council Headquarters
- Responsible for completing and submitting the proper 990 for the council (U.S. only)
- Keeps the seal of the council and affixes the same to membership cards, resolutions and other official documents as necessary

Recorder

- Responsible for keeping and maintaining a true and permanent record of all actions of the council and maintains all correspondence of the council

Treasurer

- Charged with handling council funds
- Receives money from financial secretary and deposits it in the proper council accounts
- Responsible for paying all council expenses, including assessments from the Supreme Council
- Under Section 130 of the Laws of the Order, the treasurer is automatically bonded in the amount of \$5,000 when reported on the *Election of Officers form* (#185). Additional bonding may be provided at a cost of \$7 per thousand by contacting the supreme secretary's office

Lecturer

- Appointed by the grand knight
- Responsible for providing suitable educational and entertaining programs under the "Good of the Order" section of council meetings

Advocate

- Acts as parliamentarian for the council
- Should have a working knowledge of Robert's Rules of Order, Charter, Constitution & Laws, council by-laws, and *Method of Conducting Council Meetings* (#10318)
- When needed, will seek legal assistance from the state advocate

Warden

- Responsible for supervising and maintaining all council property
- Sets up council chambers for meetings and degree exemplifications
- Oversees inside and outside guards

Inside/Outside Guards

- Attend the doors of the council chamber, checking for current membership cards and allowing entrance

Board of Trustees

- Consists of grand knight and three other elected members

- Supervises all financial business of the council and conducts the semiannual audits
- Trustees are elected for terms of three years, two years and one year. At each regular election, the position of each trustee will be voted upon, with the current three- and two-year trustees moving on to become the two- and one-year trustees, respectively

Program Director

- Appointed by the grand knight
- Collaborates with the grand knight in setting the calendar of council programs for the year
- Manages each service program director and chairman as they implement the council's programs and activities
- Keeps accurate records of council programs for reporting on the *Annual Survey of Fraternal Activity* and the *Columbian Award Application*
- Keeps council's public relations chairman informed of all programs and activities for promotion to local media

Membership Director

- Appointed by the grand knight
- Collaborates with the grand knight and council leaders on council membership goals for the year
- Manages the Recruitment Committee, Retention Committee and Insurance Promotion Committee chairmen as they implement the council's membership activities
- Plans and coordinates the council's schedule of recruitment programs.

ROSE & ROSARY PROGRAM: Our Council distributes Knights of Columbus rosaries at the baptisms held the 2nd and 4th Saturday of the month at noon. A rosary is given to each family and it is a beautiful meaningful part of the ceremony.
