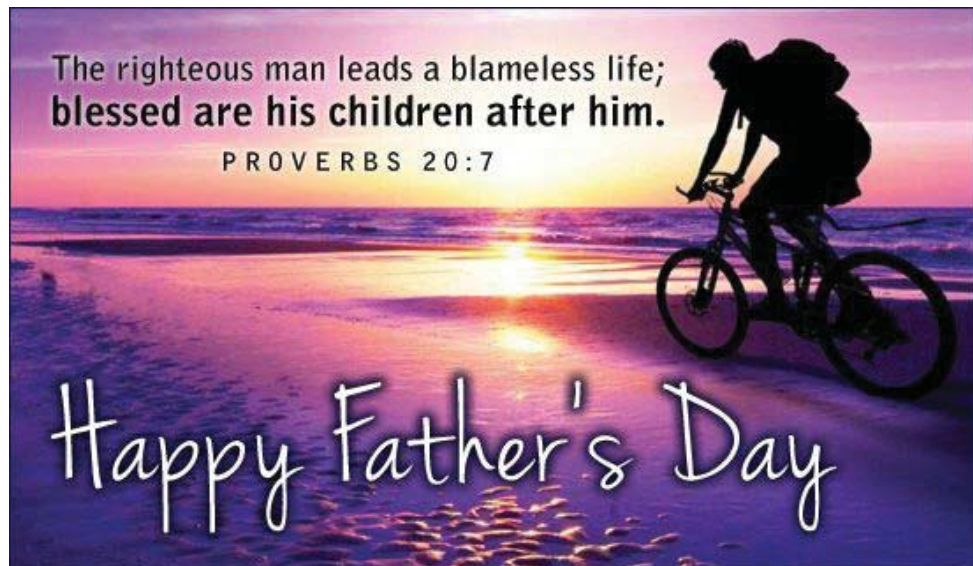

Dear Brothers,

We are in the final month of the Columbian year and your current officers are about to give up their post. Many of them will be moving to a new post with new responsibilities. I want to thank the current officers for their year of service. Without them our councils would not function. Thank you brothers. The last quarter of your year has been very different that what we expected and possibly quite challenging. You have done well

The month of June is election month. Actually, it is the last half of May and the first part of June. If you are a 3rd Degree Knight I encourage to seek a seat at the officer's table. If you are not a 3rd Degree Knight I encourage you to get your 3rd Degree and then seek a seat at the officer's table. Being an officer really teaches you how the council actually runs. It is also an opportunity to show leadership among your brother knights. A lesson that will teach you more than any textbook ever could.

But not everyone is called to be an officer at this time. I get that. The council also needs members that are not officers. Members that step up time and time again to help out with activities and to roll up their sleeves and get the work done. Also know that some of the director positions are required to take the Knight's Safe Environment Training within the first 60 days of the new Columbian year if they haven't taken it or their training has expired. Please get that done soon on behalf of your council and for the children of your parish.

But as we transition from the 2019 - 2020 Columbian year to the 2020 - 2021 Columbian year there is much to be done. We need to hold elections. The Worthy Financial Secretary has to fill out the forms reflecting the election results and submit them to Supreme. We need to hold another audit. Whew!

But I ask for one more favor from the outgoing officers. As you reflect back on the last year I suspect that at the start of the year you felt unprepared. Help them be a better officer and help create a stronger council.

We need to be constantly reminded of our gift of freedom and of those who gave all to make sure future generations continue to know life in a free, democratic society. Freedom has NEVER been free. It has been paid for in blood many times.

Today, remembering those who have passed is only half of the task that is before us today. We must also carry their love, honor and duty forward to the future generations that will pass. Our young people and children must know who they were, what they did and why they did it. To do anything less, will be a disservice to their sacrifice and their memories.

Lord, when we honor those who died in defense of our country ... in wars far away, we need to realize that most of them were boys when they died and that they gave up two lives -- the one they were living and the one they would have lived. When they died, they gave up their chance to be husbands and fathers and grandfathers.

Dear Brothers,

I wanted to share this article from Cardinal Mindszenty, the Prince Primate, Archbishop of Esztergom, cardinal and leader of the Catholic Church in Hungary from October 2nd, 1945 to December 18, 1973. He was imprisoned by the Nazi's in World War II and later for 5 decades opposed communism and communist persecution. He was tortured and imprisoned for life, but was freed in the Hungarian Revolution of 1956 and granted political asylum at the US Embassy in Budapest where he lived for the next 15 years. He was finally allowed to leave Hungary in 1971 and died in exile in Vienna, Austria in 1975.

Here is his beautiful article:

"The most important person on earth is a mother. She cannot claim the honor of having built Notre Dame Cathedral. She need not. She has built something more magnificent than any cathedral – a dwelling for an immortal soul, the tiny perfection of her baby's body. The angels have not been blessed with such a grace. They cannot share in God's creative miracle to bring new saints to heaven. Only a human mother can. Mothers are closer to God the Creator than any other creature; God joins forces with mothers in performing this act of creation ... What on God's good earth is more glorious than this: to be a mother?"

The Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of the Church: June 1, 2020



Pope Francis has decreed that “the Memorial of the Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of the Church,” should be inscribed in the Roman Calendar on the Monday after Pentecost and be celebrated every year in churches throughout the world. The Congregation for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments announced this in a decree published by the Vatican on March 3, 2018.

They traced the history of this veneration down the centuries from the period of the early church as is reflected in the writing of St. Augustine (354-430) and St. Leo the Great, who was pope from 440-461. It recalled that St. Augustine said “Mary is the mother of the members of Christ, because with charity she cooperated in the rebirth of the faithful into the Church” while St. Leo said “the birth of the Head is also the birth of the body, thus indicating that Mary is at once Mother of Christ, the Son of God, and mother of the members of his Mystical Body, which is the Church.”

The Most Holy Trinity: June 7, 2020



This Feast Day celebrates the mystery of one God in three Persons: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. The revealed truth of the Holy Trinity is at the very root of the Church's living faith as expressed in the Creed. The mystery of the Trinity in itself is inaccessible to the human mind and is the object of faith only because it was revealed by Jesus Christ, the divine Son of the Eternal Father.

The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ: June 14, 2020



The Feast of The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, used to be known as "The Feast of Corpus Christi" commemorates the sacrament of Holy Communion in the Roman Catholic Church. This includes the receiving of the Eucharist which some Christians believe symbolizes the body and blood of Christ but which Catholics believe to be the body, blood, soul and divinity of our Lord. This feast seeks to remind us of Jesus Christ's sacrifice “Do this in remembrance of me.” - Luke 22:19; 1 Corinthians 11:24-25

**The Most Sacred Heart of Jesus
June 19, 2020**



The Feast of The Most Sacred Heart of Jesus is one of the most widely practiced and well-known devotions in the Roman Catholic Church. It takes the physical heart of Jesus as representation of His Divine love for humanity. The Feast of the Sacred Heart has been in the Roman Catholic Liturgical calendar since 1856, and is always celebrated 19 days after Pentecost Sunday. The feast of the Sacred Heart always falls on a Friday. The devotion especially emphasizes the unmitigated love, compassion, and long-suffering of the heart of Christ towards humanity.

In his Encyclical, “Misericordissimus Redemptor”, Pope Pius XI stated, “The spirit of expiation or reparation has always had the first and foremost place in the worship given to the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus”.

The Immaculate Heart of the Blessed Virgin Mary: June 20, 2020



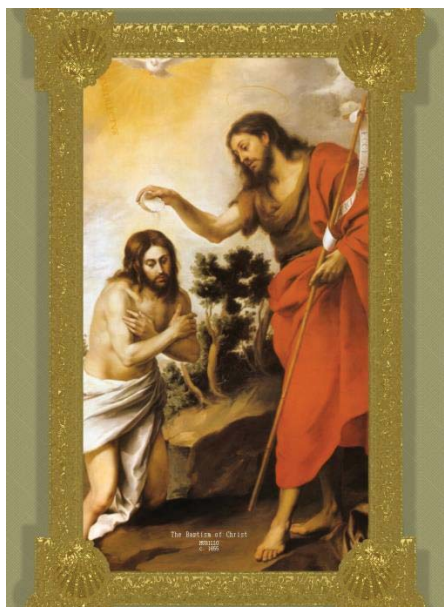
The Memorial of the Immaculate Heart of Mary celebrates the interior life of the Blessed Virgin Mary. We remember her joys and sorrows, her virtues and hidden perfections, and above all, her love for God the Father, her maternal love for her son Jesus, and her compassionate love for all people.

Traditionally, the heart of Mary in artwork is depicted with seven wounds or swords, in homage to the seven sorrows of Mary. Also, roses or another type of flower may be wrapped around the heart.

Nevertheless, it was not until after the Apparitions at Rue du Bac made to Catherine Labouré in 1830, and the establishment of a society dedicated to the Immaculate Heart of Mary, at the Church of Our Lady of Victories in Paris in 1836, that this particular devotion became really well known.

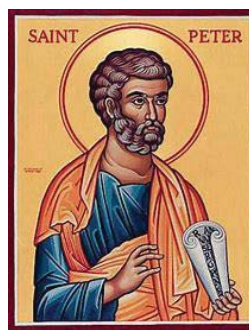
Since then devotion to the Immaculate Heart of Mary, has gradually grown more widespread in the Church, particularly since the apparitions at Fatima.

Nativity of John the Baptist: June 24, 2020

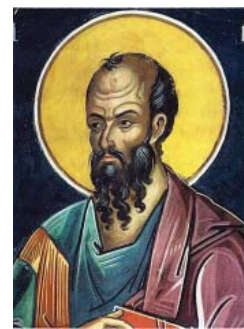


This day commemorates the life of John the Baptist, a Jewish prophet who baptized Jesus in the Jordan River. Many centuries ago, as Christianity spread through France, celebrations for the summer solstice began to merge with Saint John the Baptist's feast day, June 24. The feast day for his birth is celebrated on June 24.

Sts Peter and Paul, Apostles June 29,2020

On June 29 the Church celebrates the feast day of Sts. Peter & Paul. Together, they are the founders of the See of Rome, through their preaching, ministry and martyrdom there. Peter, who was named Simon, was a fisherman of Galilee.. Jesus gave him the name Cephas (Petrus in Latin), which means 'Rock,' because he was to become the rock upon which Christ would build His Church.

Peter was a bold follower of the Lord. He was the first to recognize that Jesus was "the Messiah, the Son of the living God," and eagerly pledged his fidelity until death. The Acts of the Apostles illustrates his role as head of the Church after the Resurrection and Ascension of Christ. Peter led the Apostles as the first Pope and ensured that the disciples kept the true faith.

St. Peter spent his last years in Rome, eventually being martyred in the year 64 AD. Tradition tells us that when St. Peter was martyred, he insisted that he be crucified upside down as he did not believe he was worthy to be crucified in the manner as his Lord.

St. Paul was the Apostle of the Gentiles. His letters are included in the writings of the New Testament, and through them we learn much about his life and the faith of the early Church. Before receiving the name Paul, he was Saul, a Jewish pharisee who zealously persecuted Christians in Jerusalem. Saul's conversion took place as he was on his way to Damascus to persecute the Christian community there. As he was traveling along the road, he was suddenly surrounded by a great light from heaven. He was blinded and fell off his horse. He then heard a voice saying to him, "Saul, Saul, why do you persecute me?" He answered: "Who are you, Lord?" Christ said: "I am Jesus, whom you are persecuting."

Saul continued to Damascus, where he was baptized and his sight was restored. He took the name Paul and spent the remainder of his life preaching the Gospel tirelessly to the Gentiles. Paul was imprisoned and taken to Rome, where he was beheaded in the year 67AD

In a sermon in the year 395, St. Augustine of Hippo said of Sts. Peter and Paul: "Both apostles share the same feast day, for these two were one; and even though they suffered on different days, they were as one. Peter went first, and Paul followed. And so we celebrate this day made holy for us by the apostles' blood. Let us embrace what they believed, their life, their labors, their sufferings, their preaching, and their
